YouthSource Center Sun Valley

El Proyecto has maintained a partnership with Los Angeles Valley Community College for over 20 years. In recent years, we have developed trainings for our youth that include Bio-Tech, HiSET, and CNC Manufacturing. These graduates are all success stories from a recent training at Valley College.

The CNC (Computer Numeric Control) Manufacturing Academy Training offers entry level training for careers in the Aerospace industry. This training provides our young 18 to 24 year old participants a spring board toward long-term careers within the industry. These six (6) clients (five males and one female) that took the course and they all graduated and have since moved on to employment or returned to college.

The YouthSource Center is funded by the City of Los Angeles Economic and Workforce Development Department (EWDD).

Community Citizenship Workshop

El Proyecto collaborated with organizer Judy Rutt and her volunteers from Temple Judea in Tarzana and Our Lady of Grace in Encino to offer a free workshop for permanent residents who want more information about becoming a U.S. citizen.
